FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Church Family,

Do you miss being together with the Family of God at Enola First Church of God? I know I sure do! Well guess what? We have some good news! After a long period of being apart, the family of God at Enola First Church of God will begin the process of re-gathering. Balancing the Bible's admonition to "not give up meeting together" (Hebrews 10:25) with the goal to keep everyone safe, the Administrative Board came up with the following steps to re-gather God's people. On May 31, 2020 – Pentecost Sunday—ECOG will re-gather for the first time since March 15. Here is how we will do that:

Worship Services will resume in the Pavilion on May 31, 2020 at 10:45 AM.

Taking into account the importance of gathering together physically, the concerns with being in the building, the warming of the weather and the blessing of having a pavilion, the Board moved to have worship in the pavilion beginning May 31 and throughout the month of June. Why 10:45 AM instead of 10:15 AM? Many Sunday School classes are beginning to meet Sundays at 9am over the internet (through "Zoom"). We want to be sure that Sunday School participants can be a part of their classes and have ample time to come to church.

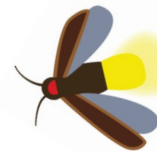

What you do:

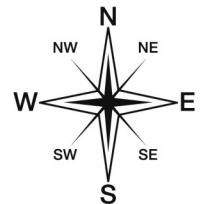
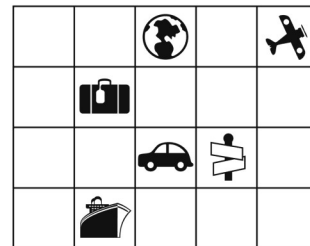
1. Carefully thread a yard of floss through the needle.

The services will last about an hour or slightly less so we should still be finished close to our normal time. We encourage the wearing of masks but this will not be required since some are not comfortable doing so. Although it will be tempting to do so, hand-shaking and hugs will be strongly discouraged. We are also asking everyone to bring their own lawn chairs. Seating areas will be designated in the pavilion to keep families and individuals safely distanced apart. A limited number of sanitized metal chairs will be provided for those who do not have their own chairs with them. We will not pass offering plates. An offering box will be provided at the pavilion entrance where worshipers can place their tithes and offerings. Bulletins with the order of worship, announcements and song lyrics will be available for download. You may download and print a paper copy before coming to worship or you can download a copy into your phone or tablet at the pavilion. Yes, our pavilion does have open WIFI. Paper copies of bulletins will be provided at the pavilion as well. No one will be required or coerced to come into the pavilion for worship. Anyone may sit in a lawn chair in the grassy areas surrounding the pavilion. Families with children may prefer to sit together on blankets in the grassy areas if that would better serve their needs. The Lower Level Restrooms in the building will be available for use. A host will be stationed under the Lower Level portico to admit persons (one at a time) into the building to use a restroom. The host will then sanitize the restrooms after each use. The rest of the Lower Level will be blocked off. Other than staff, worship service participants, and Board members, no one else will be permitted to use the office, kitchen or the rest of the inside facilities. Though we cannot offer Kids' Worship during this period of time, our Director of Children's Ministries will provide disposable "Busy Bags" with activities for children. If you are not comfortable being in proximity of other people, you are welcome to stay in your car. The service will be broadcast over a low-powered FM radio station. In other words, you will be able to hear the service on your car radio. We will provide the radio frequency (number on the dial). On a final note, worship services in the pavilion will be cancelled on a given Sunday if the weather is extremely inclement. We will publish such announcements through our website, Facebook, Twitter feed and phonevites. On a humorous note, you are welcome to wear red for Pentecost Sunday as we normally do. BUT—to celebrate that we are now in the "yellow" phase, you are welcome to wear YELLOW! I may wear some of both!

Worship Services will continue Online – available all day long every Sunday.

Knowing that staying home is still the best option for those with acute health risks and compromised immune systems, we will continue to offer an online Worship Service on Sonshine TV (ECOG's YouTube Channel) every Sunday through the end of June and possibly beyond. This will be a pre-recorded service featuring the same themes and Scriptures of the Pavilion Service. It will be made available at 12:01 AM on Sundays and available for your viewing all day long at the time of your choosing.

Other Matters to Be Aware of:

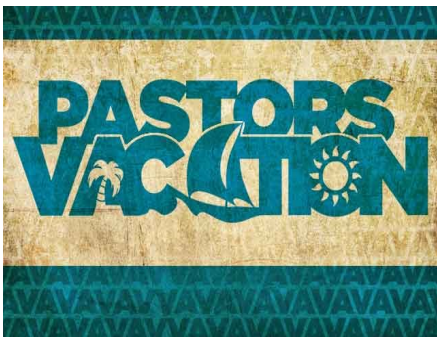
- The June edition of "The Sonshine News" will continue to be published online only. Shut-ins will receive paper copies.
- Regular office hours will not resume.
- Ministry and Service Teams will not be permitted to meet in the church until the Board gives the green light for them to do so.
- Vacation Bible School has been cancelled.
- Fellowship Events will continue to be on hold.
- We DO anticipate more re-gathering efforts. As COVID-19 restrictions ease and we move into the "green" phase, the Administrative Board will gradually allow Fellowship Events, Team meetings and other activities to occur.

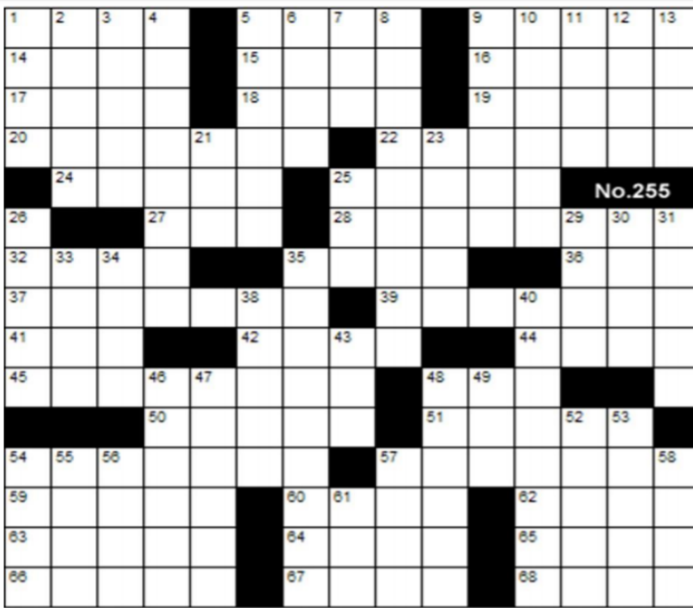

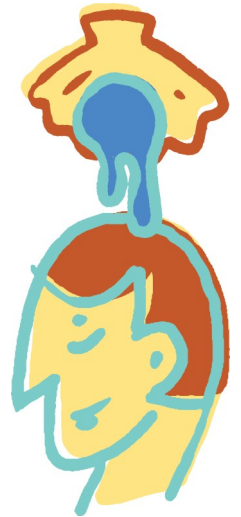
WEAR RED ON MAY 31

May 31 is Pentecost Sunday; the day that Christians traditionally recognize as the Birthday of the Church. The Holy Spirit came into the world in a new way on Pentecost and we as Christians celebrate that He comes to live in each and every believer who proclaims Jesus as Savior and Lord. It has become the custom of the Christian church to commemorate Pentecost with the color red; it serves as a reminder of the Holy Spirit appearing as cloven tongues of fire that sat upon the believers gathered together on that day. Accordingly, the paraments on the pulpit and ordinance table will be red on May 31. **In commemoration of Pentecost, and provided ECOG is open, we are inviting everyone to wear red apparel at the 10:45 am service or at home on May 31.** Red shirts and red ties are appropriate for men. Too great to grasp

For more than three decades, St. Augustine of Hippo toiled over the mind-boggling doctrine of the Trinity. According to legend, one day the church father was strolling along a shore, wrestling with this puzzle. He saw a boy running back and forth, using a seashell to pour water from the ocean into a hole he'd dug in the sand. When Augustine asked what he was doing, the boy proclaimed, "I'm going to pour the entire ocean into this hole!"

"That's impossible," replied Augustine. "The sea is so great, and the shell and the hole are so little."

"That's true," the boy said. "But it would be easier to draw all the water out of the sea and fit it into this hole than for you to fit the mystery of the Trinity and his divinity into your little intellect."

Indeed, only through faith can we accept the infinite nature of our Three-in-One God; for our finite human minds, it's simply too great to grasp.

A surprising solution

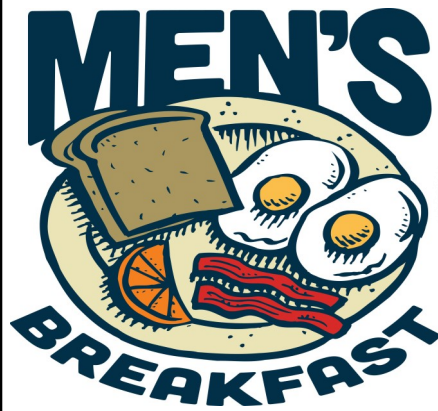

By brokenness, I mean the acknowledgment of it, the full and unflinching acceptance that we are bankrupt, poor in spirit and have nothing to offer. In our culture, that's a hard sell. ... It is, however, the one hope Jesus holds out for us, the inside-out, upside-down way that is somehow the only path that ultimately is right side up. Embrace the paradox: brokenness is the way to wholeness.

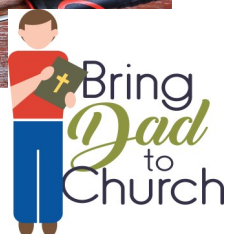

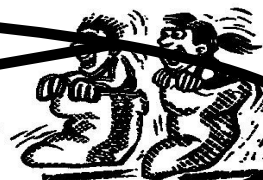

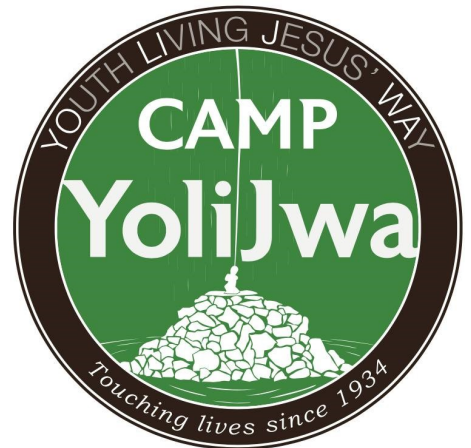
